

## SNOWBOARDING REGULATIONS

### PLAYING REGULATIONS – revised December 2014

1. Date: The SOSSA INC. Coeducational Snowboarding Championship shall be held at least one week before the OFSAA Championship at the discretion of the convenor.

2. Location: The convenor shall determine the location of the championship.

### 3. Eligibility:

To represent the school the student must be eligible under the SOSSA INC and OFSAA constitution. (See SOSSA INC. Article VII and Article VIII). They must be fully enrolled in the school they are representing.

Team lists must reach the convenor prior to the day of the event.

No changes, additions or reseeding will be allowed by the coach after the entry deadline date.

### 4. Events:

The events to be conducted are:

Womens' Giant Slalom

Mens' Giant Slalom

All events are open events (ie. no age classifications)

### 5. Meet Structure:

Two runs in each event shall be held when possible. The decision as to the starting time of the final race shall be left to the discretion of the convenor.

### 6. Entry:

Each school is entitled to enter an Open Mens' team and an Open Womens' team. A school may have up to 10 boarders race in each event. However, a team will consist of five (5) members with the score of three (3) members counting. The five snowboarders on a team must be designated by the coach on the entry sheet.

### 7. Expenses:

Expenses for SOSSA INC. championships see Article IV. A fee may be charged to cover costs.

The SOSSA INC convenor shall forward a financial statement to the SOSSA INC Administrative Secretary-Treasurer at the conclusion of the Tournament.

8. Rules and Officials:

Any boarder who is disqualified from the first run will NOT be allowed to do a second run – no exceptions.

OFSSA Regulations will be followed.

If an athlete did not finish or did not start, this negates a snowboarder from the event.

Unsportsmanlike conduct negates a snowboarder from competition that day.

Review of the course by sideslip or snow plowing only. Pre-snowboarding of the course will result in automatic disqualification (D.Q.)

9. Uniform and Equipment

Bib system will be used. Each boarder will be assigned a number and must not change numbers or this will result in a disqualification. Bibs should be visible at all times.

All snowboarders must wear safety straps or ski brakes. C.S.A. approved helmets are mandatory. (as per OPHEA Guidelines).

10. Scoring:

Team scores will be calculated by adding the best three individual total scores for that team in Giant Slalom plus the best three individual total scores in Giant Slalom. These scores will come from the five (5) snowboarders identified by the coach on the registration (entry) form.

11. Awards:

Medallions will be given out to the team immediately after results are posted in the Ski Resort Lodge or they will be mailed as soon as possible.

12. Department:

See Article X and XI - Registration material shall be given to the staff supervisor only.

13. Medical Personnel:

It is recommended that qualified First Aid personnel and equipment be available at the Championship site(s).
